#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENTS

At our Annual Meeting in May, the members elected a wonderful new Board with a good mix of talented new and returning Directors. We couldn't be happier as we need a strong team to help us with all of the challenges and opportunities facing our neighbourhood.

LRT construction in Woodpark is finally coming to an end and work is now underway to rebuild Richmond Road. The first step of this project has involved redirecting traffic to Bryon Avenue and this has not gone smoothly. On July 23rd we spent an hour with Councillor Kavanagh and representatives from the City's Stage 2 office walking along Bryon, discussing the solutions. It was apparent that better road painting and signage was needed and these are being put in place. City staff are developing options to address concerns about cut through traffic. We will host a virtual meeting August 15th for Woodparkers to comment. Watch for details to follow in the coming days.

Exciting plans for the restoration of the Bryon Linear Park, Lincoln Fields and the Parkette at Lawn and Edgeworth are now available. The WCA is organizing a public meeting on Wednesday September 25 for residents to find out more about these plans. Meeting details will be made available closer to the date. Enjoy the rest of your summer and we hope to see many of you at the mural painting on Saturday Aug 24.

# BYRON/RICHMOND AT WOODROFFE NORTH

An information session to present and discuss possible solutions to the traffic problems will be held on August 15th.

We are asking everyone to be patient, observant of traffic and to obey all traffic signs. This rerouting of traffic will be with us for about 1.5 years. We are working hard to get the right solutions in place as soon as possible.

### TREES IN WOODPARK

The Tree Team launched an initiative to encourage the planting of 100 new trees in Woodpark. Nineteen new trees have been planted. Twelve households signed up to have the City plant one or more trees on their lawn via the Trees in Trust Program and six households planted trees on their own. A big thanks to all who planted trees and to our resident arborist Barbara Hemming for all of her tree advice.

### LINCOLN FIELDS SECONDARY PLAN UPDATE

The long awaited Lincoln Fields Secondary
Plan is scheduled to be released by the end of
July and approved by the City of Ottawa's
Planning and Housing Committee in late
September. While the plan is expected to
provide much needed housing for 10,000 new
residents in the area, it will also change the
character of Woodpark with high rise
developments along Carling Ave and on the
west side of Edgeworth. We will want to let the
Planning and Housing Committee know what
we think about the plan. Please watch for a

### 2025 PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

The City of Ottawa is proposing a major update to its zoning bylaw. The goal is to allow for denser housing developments, especially near public transit stations. Here's a breakdown of the key changes:

- The new system classifies areas based on maximum building height and density.
- Woodpark will see a significant increase in density, especially along Carling and Woodroffe. Most areas will be zoned to allow buildings up to 11 meters high with a target density of 12 units per standard lot.
- · Car sharing will be allowed in all residential zones.
- New provisions encourage building design that preserves mature trees.
- Emergency shelters and group homes will be permitted in neighbourhood zones.
- Mid- and high-rise buildings will need to dedicate a portion of units to families.
